1. INTRODUCTION

Congratulations! You are about to become part of the best student soccer club in Rotterdam: R.S.V. Antibarbari. For us, it's not just about soccer, but above all about fun, friendships, parties, and traditions that will make your student days unforgettable.

This booklet is your survival guide. In it, you will find everything you need to know: how matches and training sessions work, how you can participate in the legendary Thursday evening in the canteen, and which parties, committees, and trips you really don't want to miss.

And remember: you are never alone. For soccer-related matters, you can always contact Floris (Technical Commissioner), and for everything else, contact Yara (Vice-Chair). The rest of the board is of course always there for you too - whether it's for a question, a beer, or a good story.

2. COMPETITION PREPARATIONS

Before the competition can start, a few things need to be arranged. Below are the things that require some attention.

2.A. TEAM STRUCTURE

A team at Antibarbari often consists of match members and training members. The name says it all: training members only train, while match members train and also play matches. When a team is formed, it often consists of 22 match members and a number of training members.

Players who only participate during practice typically aren't allowed to play any official matches. These players are not registered with the KNVB (Dutch football association), which may lead to problems if they play a match. In extreme cases, if there are not enough players available for a match, a training member may be allowed to play once, in consultation with the secretary. Please contact the Secretary (Isabelle Schaap) first, her details can be found in *7.a. Board*.

2.B. MATCH KITS

All match players, of course, need to have their kit before the start of the competition. The Technical Commissioner orders the kits. Before ordering the kits, the Technical Commissioner will get in touch with the team captain to get to know all the sizes, back numbers and names that the team needs. The costs of the kits will need to be paid by the players. This automatically means that the kit is your own possession. The costs are around 85 euros.

Goalkeepers will, of course, be provided with a goalkeeper kit. This kit also costs approximately 85 euros. Goalkeeper gloves are not automatically included in the kit. But it is possible to order these upon request. These costs will again be for either the individual or their team.

At the start of the season, our clothing supplier is very busy. Normally, the shipping time is two weeks. Due to the busy period, it is possible that match clothing will not be delivered before the start of the season. If this is the case, the Technical Commissioner will contact the team captain and look for a suitable solution.

2.C. MATCH RULES

Before the start of the competition, the Secretary must register/transfer all players with/to the KNVB. International players, players who have never played soccer before, and players born after 1998 must obtain a 'Rules of the Game' certificate from the KNVB. This is the KNVB regulation. Players who already have soccer experience or have played soccer recently will often already have this certificate. Players who still need to obtain the certificate will receive an email from the KNVB with further instructions.

2.D. ERASMUS SPORTS PASS

The contribution of the competition membership includes an Erasmus sports pass. This pass can be collected from Erasmus Sport as soon as the payment has been made and the Treasurer/Secretary has forwarded the payment batch to Erasmus Sport. If you have chosen to pay in installments, you don't have to wait until the first installment has been paid before you can start exercising. Your name will simply be included in the first batch.

The board will let the team know when each batch has been sent, so we recommend paying your contribution as soon as possible to be able to pick up your sports pass as soon as possible!

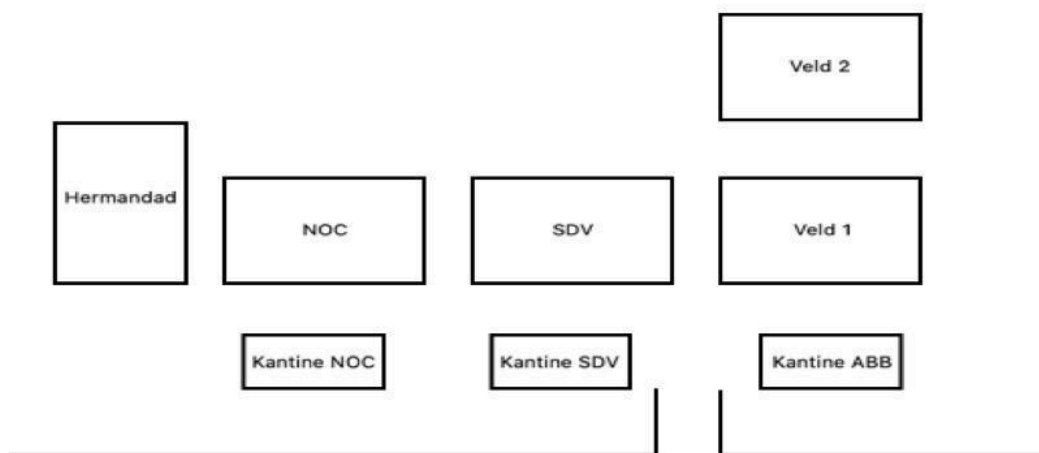
With the sports pass, you can attend group classes at Erasmus Sport and reserve courts. You can also use it to go to the gym for an additional fee of 75 euros.

3. PRACTICE

All practices take place on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. At Antibarbari, all recreational teams train themselves. Someone is appointed to prepare the training. It is also possible to set up a training committee within the team, this can be helpful. There will also be a section on our website with inspiration for practices, this can be very useful :) Of course, a team can always look for a trainer if they prefer to do so.

3.A. FIELD SCHEME

Antibarbari has two fields available for practice, field 2 and Hermandad (HDAD). Below you will find an image of the sports park with the fields. The training schedule can be found at the board table in the canteen of Antibarbari.



3.B. MATERIALS

Every new team will receive 5 new balls, cones, bibs and a ball bag from the club. Antibarbari often has a lot of bibs and cones, so if you need more you can always ask the Technical Commissioner.

5 Balls are not a lot, so please take good care of them! This means that if the ball ends up in the ditch you will need to get it out. If you would like to have more balls, the technical commissioner can order them for you for 25 euros per ball.

Every team (with the exception of new teams) will receive 2 balls each season. As soon as these balls are delivered, the Technical Commissioner will send a message to the captains that they will be able to get them.

Each team has its own locker in storage room B or D where they can store their equipment. You can pick up your gear here on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays. There is also a ball pump near the lockers in storage room D in case any balls need to be inflated. You are welcome to do this yourself.

There are small goals available on both training fields. These goals may be used as long as they are returned to the collection point next to the canteen after training. There are of course also large goals on both fields. Since multiple teams train on one field, it is important to take turns using the goals, so please discuss this among yourselves.

3.C. SCHAFT

Every Tuesday and Thursday evening, it is possible to enjoy a meal at Antibarbari! For only 4,50 euros you will get a meal including a dessert! A lot of teams take this opportunity. There are always two shifts. The first shift is at 18:30 and the second shift at 19:30. Usually, about 100 people eat at the club.

You can sign up for Tuesday's dinner between Monday 12:00 and Tuesday 12:00. For Thursday's dinner, you can sign up between Wednesday 12:00 and Thursday 12:00. An instagram story is always posted with what will be cooked for dinner. There is always a vegetarian option.

You can sign up for dinner via the website. Here you respond to the 'Schaft' message with your name, the shift you want to eat in and if you are vegetarian or not. It is also possible to respond with a list of names of several people from your team. Dinner is always cooked by first-year members: you will receive additional information about this from the Vice-Chair.

You can pay in cash or by card. It is also possible to purchase a 'schaft' card. A 'schaft' card costs €22,50 and gets you six lunches (5+1 free)!

If you eat dinner with 8 or more players from your team, you can get a 'schaftpitcher' (beer pitcher) for free! You just need to mention this to one of the board members and you will be able to get the pitcher the same evening :)

3.D. COOKING SHIFTS AND CLEANING SHIFTS

It's important to know that in your first year, it is **mandatory** to do shifts to help keep the club running. These are cooking shifts that we just briefly discussed, from 14:00-18:00 on either Tuesday or Thursday you will cook the dinner for that evening with other first-years. The groceries will be done in advance by the Vice Chair. After this shift, you can eat for free and you are always welcome to stay at the club.

Cleaning shifts start at 12:00 PM and last until 3:00 PM on Mondays and Fridays. With these shifts you and other first-years will ensure that the building is tidy again. There is always someone from the board or a staff-member to ensure that this is managed in the right direction and the board ensures that the right equipment is present.

If you can't make it to your cooking or cleaning shift, you can arrange to switch with another first year, or you can find a replacement. **If you can't find a solution and you don't show up on the day of your cooking or cleaning shift, you will be fined 60 euros.**

A small side note: these shifts are a really nice way to get to know the board, the club, and of course other first years at the club :)

4. MATCHES

Matches are played on Sundays. Only Tiem Veeg will play soccer on Saturdays this season. Each team has a fixed playing time for home games.

4.A. MATCH REGISTRATION

Before the match, it must be determined which players are present. It is possible to enter a maximum of 18 players on the match form. All players present must be listed on the match form, and an assistant referee must also be listed. If you have more than 18 players available on Sunday, choices will have to be made, and the captain could ask other teams if they could use some additional players.

The match form can still be filled out during the match, but it is recommended to fill it out before the start of the match. Do not fill it out too early, as you can only fill it out once and from then on only the Secretary can make any changes on the match form. Only players that are 18+ can fill out the form. This needs to be done via the KNVB app called 'Wedstrijdzaken'. You can log in with the same username and password as you use to log into 'voetbal.nl'.

4.B. AWAY MATCHES

Transport to the away matches needs to be arranged by the team. Depending on where the match will take place you can choose to go by train, bike or car. You can meet your teammates at Antibarbari, where you can also collect the materials you will need. After the match you are, of course, welcome to have some drinks at Antibarbari!

4.C. REFEREES

Antibarbari has a referee committee. They make sure all recreational teams can play their matches at Antibarbari. The Secretary will make sure there is a referee for each match. You as the home team pay €30 to the referee in cash.

The task of assistant referee (flagman) is performed by the team themselves, often by a substitute. For away games, the other team will ofcourse arrange a referee.

4.D. STATISTICS

During the season, we keep track of a few different statistics. You can find all these match statistics under 'Tiems' on our website www.antibarbari.nl. This is a nice way to know what is going on with the other teams. You can also find an update on our instagram page!

4.D.1. H.E.L.D

This is the so-called Heldere Evaluatie Der Lege Doelen (Clear Evaluation of Empty Goals) consisting of our lesser soccer gods, who do everything in their power to keep their goal clean. In this ranking you can find all goalkeepers with a clean sheet.

4.D.2. D.R.A.N.K

This is the 'Doelpuntenmakers der R.S.V. Antibarbari in een Nutteloos Klassement' (The goal scorers of Antibarbari in a useless ranking). Here you can find all players who scored a goal or gave an assist.

4.D.3. DE GOUDEN ZAAG

A wise man once said that a saw is the last option for a football player. We just love to see struggle and incompetence. The Kelderklasse (basement league) is not the Kelderklasse without some golden saws. The rules:

Yellow card = 1 point

2 x Yellow card = 2 points

Red card = 3 points

4.E. MATCH REPORT

Some teams at Antibarbari love to write reports on their matches. Those reports often are about everything except the actual football match. To get an idea of the reports, you can have a look at the archive on our website! If your team would like to do this, please do so and send it to secretaris@antibarbari.nl so we can publish the report on our website! A different way to keep up with different teams is via Instagram, every team has their own account, there are a lot of nice videos and photos to be found.

If your team is not that active or does not have an account yet, you could try to make it more active again :)

5. RESPONSIBILITIES CAPTAIN

The captain is the team's organiser. There is more to it than most people think, and the role of captain is therefore somewhat underappreciated. So here's a shoutout to all captains!

5.A. BOARD

As captain, you are the team's point of contact for the board. You will be added to the group chat with all the other captains. This is useful if you have too few or too many players on a Sunday, so you can see if you can check with other teams if you can help each other out. All activities that are organised and other announcements will also be sent in the group chat by a board member. It is the captains responsibility to forward these messages into their team's groupchat, to make sure that everybody has the same amount of information.

Twice a year, you will have a meeting with the Technical Commissioner (Floris) to discuss how the season is going, including things such as what you feel is missing within the team and what you still want to achieve. You also discuss whether you need new materials. Each team gets a budget of 50 euros + 2 balls per year. Good to know is that if you choose not to spend these 50 euros in one year, this amount will not build up over the years. Really try to be careful with the materials that are provided for you, so if you shoot a ball in the water you will help your team by retrieving it!

5.B. PRACTICES

Each team can store its materials in a locker. The board has all the codes. It's important to be careful with these locks, so please make sure you don't break of or lose them.

The trainings have to be prepared; this is basically the task of the captain. As a team you could of course make other agreements about this and you could also outsource it to other players. As mentioned before there will be a section on our site where you can find information and inspiration about practices!

5.C. MATCHES

1. Taking inventory of the presence of players/players.
2. In case of too many/not enough players/players look at possibilities in other teams
3. Make sure there are enough outfits, if not contact the technical commissioner
4. Make sure there are 30 euros in cash for the referee at home matches
5. Arranging transport to away matches
6. Making the line-up and determining the substitutions
7. Completing the match sheet
8. Passing statistics in the captain's app (see 4.d. Statistics).

We know this is a lot of work! So don't be afraid to delegate tasks to others within your team. After all, it should all remain fun.

6. ACTIVITIES

Antibarbari is a real student football association where the balance between playing football and having fun is very important. On Tuesday and Thursdays evenings after training, there is always a great atmosphere in the canteen and we often party until the early hours.

In addition to the 'regular' Tuesdays and Thursdays, there are also other events, such as tournaments, a karaoke night, a ski trip and so on. Every year, an activity calendar is put together, which can be found on social media, and there is also a monthly update with the important dates for that month. This can be found on Instagram and in the canteen.

6.A. CALENDAR

There are a few dates during the season that you should already block in your calendar! You really can't miss these activities! A detailed calendar listing all planned activities will follow soon.

6.B. COMMITTEES

To ensure that everything runs smoothly within Antibarbari and that all activities can be carried out, there are many committees. Below is an overview of all committees! If you would like to join a committee, feel free to talk to a board member or send us a message! Joining a committee is the perfect chance to get to know the club, and also the other members. Antibarbari is full of nice people :)

6.B.1. PARTY COMMITTEE

The most fun committee at ABB! As a member, you will help organise the best parties and activities, such as the Christmas gala, a pub quiz, or a beer pong tournament - and you can come up with new ideas yourself.

What you do: Organize parties and activities at ABB. Think of the gala, the pub quiz and the beer pong tournament.

Why it's fun: You will quickly get to know many members and you can unleash your creativity when coming up with new parties and activities.

Time commitment: A meeting every so often, plus time spent on activities.

6.B.2. MARKETING COMMITTEE

The creative engine behind ABB! You come up with and create content for social media, keep members engaged, and give the club a face. This is especially fun this year because you can also contribute ideas about marketing for our Lustrum year.

What you do: Create posts and stories, write reports, share photos and videos.

Why it's fun: You get to unleash your creativity and everyone gets to see your work.

Time commitment: Flexible, often behind your laptop or phone.

6.B.3. TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE

The tournament committee organises all football tournaments during the season. There is the SLET tournament (Selection and Lower Teams Tournament), in January there is the Bal-door-'t-dak indoor tournament, in June there are 2 evenings ZAV (Summer evening football) and we also have SAV (September evening football). Many of these tournaments are linked to a theme and a party afterwards!

What you do: Help organise all the different tournaments we have at ABB.

Why it's fun: The aforementioned tournaments are all true ABB traditions. This sets us apart from other students associations and soccer clubs.

6.B.4. SPONSORING COMMITTEE

ABB's funding comes from three different sources: membership fees, canteen sales, and sponsors or donors. If you are a smooth talker and would like to help connect Antibarbari with valuable sponsors and donors, then the sponsorship committee is definitely for you!

What you do: Approach partners, come up with creative campaigns, maintain contact with donors

Why it's fun: You'll learn a lot about acquisition and sales

Time commitment: Ongoing, but flexible depending on your tasks.

6.B.5. ABB OPEN COMMITTEE

Antibarbari's biggest soccer event. During the day there is a soccer tournament for both members and non-members, then in the evening there is a big party with live music. In recent years, between 700 and 800 people have participated.

What you do: Depending on your position within the board, you will be involved in arranging the permit, creating a tournament schedule, arranging the decorations, and so on.

Why it's fun: ABB Open is a well-known event among all Antibarbari members. If you want to get to know a lot of people at the club and are unsure about joining the board for a year, the ABB Open Committee is the perfect stepping stone.

Time commitment: A period of about 4 months prior to the event you will have weekly meetings. And a lot of effort on the day itself!

6.B.6. BIRTHDAYTRIP COMMITTEE

As you will read later in this handbook, we are celebrating our 7th Lustrum this year! Every year, Antibarbari organises their birthday with a multi-day trip. Because this year is our 7th Lustrum, it will be a special edition. You definitely don't want to miss this. Keep an eye on our social media for the exact dates and other important information.

6.B.7. ANTIBARBASKI COMMITTEE

As you will read later in this handbook, we are celebrating our 7th Lustrum this year! Every year, a delegation of Antibarbarianen heads to the ski slopes to enjoy some skiing and apres-ski. Because of our Lustrum, this year's celebration will be even bigger!

6.B.8. EUREKAWEEK COMMITTEE

Every year during the Eurekaweek, we try to recruit as many new, enthusiastic members as possible for our club. To this end, we work hard during the summer to come up with a fun series of activities. Are you a social person who enjoys getting other people excited about everything our club has to offer? Then the Eurekaweek Committee is for you!

What you do: Actively recruit new members for our wonderful club!

Why it's fun: You can put your social skills to the test and get to know lots of (potential) new members right away.

Time commitment: A few meetings during the summer months and active throughout Eurekaweek!

6.B.9. TECHNICAL COMMITTEE

The technical committee is busy with all matters relating to the selection. It is a responsible and serious committee. Tasks include recruiting players, recruiting staff members, and ensuring that the season runs

smoothly. There are two technical committees, one for the men's teams and one for the women's team. If you find football important and interesting, this committee could be a good fit for you. It's a fun way to get to know the serious side of soccer.

What you do: You will be in close contact with either the women's or men's teams and will guide/assist them where necessary.

Why it's fun: If you are interested in football-related topics and want to improve your knowledge or skills in this area, this is a great committee for you.

Time commitment: Meetings when necessary, otherwise working independently.

6.B.10 ANTIBLABLABLAD

Twice a year, Antibarbari publishes the Antiblablalad. This is a magazine that keeps you fully informed about all the latest developments at the association. Think of gossip heard in the corridors, the fixweb, and our H.E.L.D. and D.R.A.N.K. ranking.

What you do: Together with a fun team, you will create a magazine about the club. You can be creative with the content of the sections and the layout.

Why it's fun: You stay very well informed about everything going on within the association.

Time commitment: In the run-up to publication, meetings are held when necessary and you work on this independently.

6.B.11 INTRODUCTORY WEEKEND COMMITTEE

This is the introduction weekend for all first-year students. This year, it will take place from November 7th till 9th. Keep these dates free! This weekend is perfect for getting to know not only your teammates but also other people from Antibarbari, especially other first-year members.

What you do: You will be organising one of the most enjoyable weekends for first-year students at Antibarbari.

Why it's fun: It is very important for the atmosphere at the club that first-years are well integrated into our culture. By organising an enjoyable introduction weekend for them, you will help achieve this.

Time commitment: Weekly meetings from the end of September until the weekend itself. And of course, you will come on the weekend too!

6.B.12 FIRST-YEAR COMMITTEE

This committee was set up especially with and for first-years. Are you a new Antibarbari member and do you have lots of fun, original ideas that you want to share to make our club (even) better? The committee is supervised by the vice-chair, who is your point of contact anyways. But apart from that, it's entirely up to you as first-years to run this committee.

What you do: Together with other first-years, think about how you can make the club more fun and accessible for yourselves and other newcomers.

Why it's fun: You can actively make a difference in how first-year students experience our club. And who knows that better than you, as a first year yourself?

Time commitment: Throughout the year, there are a number of regular events that are always organised by this committee. You are also always free to share your own input.

6.B.13 COOKING COMMITTEE

The cooking committee is a super fun group of people who get together every once in a while to cook a 'Schaft Special' for the members. This is a 3-course dinner as schaft and is therefore prepared with the committee, often accompanied by a beer and lots of fun. If you have any further questions about this, please contact the vice-chair.

What you do: You occasionally make schaft extra ‘special’ by preparing an appetizer or baking a dessert.

Why it’s fun: You enjoy cooking and are happy to do this for the members of ABB.

Time commitment: No fixed availability or commitment.

6.B.14 HAND-IN-HAND COMMISSION

The hand-in-hand committee is Antibarbari's committee that gives back to the community. For example, it raises money for charities, does activities with lonely elderly people, and collects clothing donations for those in need. This committee is extremely important and ensures that Antibarbari is socially involved!

What you do: You work to strengthen the connection between Antibarbari and community. You organise activity days or fundraising campaigns/

Why it’s fun: You enjoy working towards a greater cause. We at Antibarbari benefit greatly from a close relationship with our community. By strengthening this relationship, we as a club can also grow on a social level.

6.B.15 INTERNATIONAL COMMITTEE

Every year, more internationals join ABB, so we thought it would be a good idea to set up a committee with internationals.

Because it is a fairly new committee, we want to use the input from internationals at the club to determine what is desired and needed to make everyone feel welcome and connected. This include organising various events, translating important documents, and serving as a first point of contact. All ideas are welcome to help shape this committee.

6.C. LUSTRUM YEAR

This year, we at ABB are celebrating a special milestone: our 7th Lustrum! That means a year full of extra parties, special activities, and unforgettable memories. We are keeping the theme a secret for now, but it will be announced later this year.

A few highlights to look forward to are the Lustrum Opening Party on January 4th 2025, the Lustrum Ski Trip and the Lustrum Birthday Trip! In addition, there will be numerous other lustrum activities throughout the year. In short: make sure you join, because a lustrum will make your student days truly unforgettable.

6.D. BOARD YEAR

At Antibarbari it is possible to do a board year! This is a very educational part-time board, in which you meet one evening a week, are present on Tuesday and Thursday evenings and of course also on Sundays. The extra time you spend on your board depends on your position. If this appeals to you, it is often a good idea to join a committee to get more involved in the association and make your interest known to the board during the season! If you have any questions about a board year or about the available positions, feel free to ask the board!

7. ANTIBARBARI

Antibarbari was founded on June 12, 1991. Our club name 'Antibarbari' comes from one of the works of Desiderius Erasmus. In 1520, he wrote the book 'Antibarbarorum Liber', which loosely translates to 'The Book of the Uncivilized'. This title in the nominative singular case is freely translated as Antibarbari.

Antibarbari currently has 23 teams, 17 men's teams and 6 women's teams. The first two men's teams and the first women's team form our selection. Fortunately, in addition to our selections, there are plenty of other teams where you can showcase your qualities. With teams at all levels, there is always a team that suits your level!
